Grand Opening of the new Early Childhood Center

God has blessed us with a new 3500 square foot modular building in which we have been able to expand our Early Childhood program to include new Pre-K students as well as two additional preschool classrooms. We started the year with 76 students who were new to our program and it continues to grow.

Our Early Childhood program is built around three strong biblical truths:

God Made Me, God Loves Me,

He Wants to Be My Best Friend Forever.





These foundational truths allow us to plant the seeds of learning on fertile soil in the hearts and minds of these young children. Mark 4:3–8 talks about seeds

that are scattered in shallow, rocky soil withering and dying; yet seeds that are planted in deep fertile soil sprout, grow and multiply. This is the heart and passion of our staff as they pour into each of the young lives God has entrusted to them in their classroom. Our desire is that each student begins his/her academic years knowing all knowledge stems from the Lord and is to be used for His glory!

STEAM has a NEW Lab at the Elementary Campus

Our students are "perfectly and wonderfully made", each with their own talents and abilities. To spark an interest and passion in all our students, we've intentionally added ARTS to our STEM Labs. It's all about sparking this interest in all students at our elementary through creativity and hands-on lessons. Using all elements of STEAM, (science, technology, engineering, art, and math) students apply creative thinking,





problem solving, collaboration, and design skills to master a challenge or project. In a recent project, students designed and painted spawning salmon river ecosystem with enough food for each species with blended, realistic colors and scale. God has provided both a new permanent classroom for STEAM, and an outside classroom and pollinator garden, too.





Grant Awards Update:

- \$3,000 from St. Alphonsus Auxiliary Foundation for our Emergency Preparedness Kits. We are striving to be prepared and aware, keeping our students and staff safe.
- \$10,000 from The Brandt Foundation for an outdoor STEAM Lab (4 new outdoor gazebos and an outdoor classroom to marvel at God's creation).
- \$2,500 from Feed a Bee for a pollinator garden which will increase the pollinators in our area to help with our local ecosystem and food supply. Teaches students to care for God's creation.

- 1. Given how strongly we believe that a child's emotional health impacts their overall learning and development, our School Board approved adding "Emotionally" to our mission statement.
- 2. Drawing from the premise that spiritual health is the engine that drives the train of emotional well-being, which in turn leads to healthy relationships and improved student learning, our focus will be on developing Spiritual, Emotional, and Relational health slightly tweaking the well-researched Social Emotional Learning (SEL) model to be uncompromisingly biblical.

We will use the following resources to train teachers on healthy interactions, as we implement this initiative:

- · Clifton Strengths Quest assessment
- The Social Emotional Learning model and tools
- · Shepherding a Child's Heart by Ted Tripp
- Your Christian School: A Culture of Grace? Video series
 The Age of Opportunity by Paul Tripp
- · Seminars on emotional health and suicide prevention


New Position Enhances Security and Mentoring


