As coach of the 7th grade girls' basketball team, of which my daughter is a

member, I invited Sarah to turn her disappointment into an opportunity to mentor and coach these young ladies. They have respected and admired her as a player for years. She agreed and the team was elated. Sarah's response to adversity as well as her example, advice, honesty, and influence throughout



the season had a deep spiritual impact on our young Chargers.

As a father, my greatest desire is to help my children know Jesus. No amount of money could purchase the positive influence for Jesus that Sarah has had in my daughter's life. In this experience, we witnessed 3 generations of mentors having now invested in the 4th generation, thus leaving my daughter inspired to serve the next.

Our students are not perfect at CVCS, just as none of us are. Thankfully, perfection is not what God requires of us in order to serve Him. Jesus, though perfect Himself, took on all of our imperfections so that we can be reconciled to God. It is that great news that Sarah, and so many of her classmates, have come to grasp and desire to share with the world. Sarah will be doing that in a gap year global outreach program called the 'World Race'. Others of the class of 2017 will spend next year on the mission field of college campuses, the workplace or training for ministry. We pray that the foundation of the Grace, Truth, and Love of our Lord Jesus will guide them in all their many endeavors, and that they may reach their fullest potential in serving Him in whatever good works He has prepared for them to do.





"Fashioned in Freedom" Fashion Show Benefits Wipe Every Tear


