## High School Profile • 2019-2020

Cole Valley Christian Schools (CVCS) is an Early Childhood Education through 12<sup>th</sup> grade private, Christian school with just over 940 students on two campuses. The Secondary Campus, located in Meridian, Idaho, houses grades 7-12. The four-year high school's current enrollment is approximately 290 students. Founded in 1972, the school is a ministry of Cole Community Church with a student body representing over 100 churches from throughout the Treasure Valley.
